

What is the ETA 2824-2 movement?

The ETA 2824-2 has become one of the most popular movements in the industry and is commonly found inside entry-level Swiss mechanical watches. With sales outside Swatch Group restricted after 2021, most today use the similar Sellita SW200 Family instead of ETA's movements.

What is ETA 2824-2?

ETA 2824-2 is a movement that is now known as ETA 2824-2. The “-2” suffix refers to its generation. Watches that feature this calibre include the Tissot Carson via the Powermatic 80 movement. A modified version of this movement runs the IWC Pilot Mark XVIII, improved with 42 hours of power reserve and renamed as Calibre 30110. Moreover, there is another movement called ETA 2892.A2.

What is a ETA 2800?

**BRANDS:** ETA developed the 2800 family of movements from their ETA 2700 family, and the design dates back almost a century. It is a compact movement of 11.5 or 13 ligne and is easily serviceable and reliable.

What is the power reserve of ETA 2836-2?

As of 2021, the official ETA website claims that this movement has a typical power reserve of 42 hours. The ETA 2836-2 is popular among high-end luxury watches. Getting this movement from ETA is almost impossible as these movements are created and shipped to major watchmakers.

What is the difference between ETA 2836-2 and ETA 2824-2?

Both movements are very similar as the ETA 2836-2 is an advancement of the ETA 2824-2. The two movements have a similar diameter of 25.6mm. The main difference between these two movements is that 2836 holds a day-date calendar complication while 2824 houses only the date complication.

How long does an ETA 2824-2 last?

A normal ETA 2824-2 will run for about 38 hours before it stops; the C07.111 delivers its energy for 80 hours. That is not only achieved with an improved spring barrel; it also got a new construction concept that works more efficiently than its predecessor from 1961.

This may be true, but the price of the movement alone (2824-2) will run as much as an entire watch with a 7S26 movement (Monster, Samurai, etc). The 7S26 shouldn't really be compared to the 2824. As Isthmus

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said, the R caliber Seiko movements (6R15 for example) are a much better comparison.

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Strangely, watchies are sniffy enough about makers dropping standard ETA 2824-2 movements into their cases. There's still the feeling that in-house is somehow better than an off-the-shelf movement from Switzerland's biggest movement maker. Lord alone knows what collectors will make of Sellita's SW200, Miyota's 9015, and Seiko's 6R15 ...

The ETA 2824-2 is a "workhorse" of ETA SA's line of mechanical movements. ETA is a wholly owned subsidiary of Swatch Group, meaning many of Swatch Group's brands are powered by ETA movements. ... Raven's 40mm Trekker, 44mm Endeavour and 47mm Titanium Deep (currently sold out) also use the ETA

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2824-2 movement. The watches are offered ...

One of the most common Swiss watch movements, the ETA 2824-2 is the third refinement of the original ETA 2824. Like most ETA movements, Cal. 2824-2 is available in Standard, Elaborate, Top, and Chronometer versions. The similar ETA 2836-2 adds a day wheel. Cal. 2824-2 replaced Cal. 2824-1 in 1982 and remained in production through 2021.

This movement vibrates at 28,800 beats per hour with 42 hours of power reserve and 21 jewels. It's a lot thinner than the ETA 2824 at 3.6mm. It offers as an exceptional base for most chronograph movements. As earlier mentioned, the Omega Co-Axial movement is based on an ETA movement -- the ETA 2892.A2, for this matter.

What is the difference between ETA caliber 2824-2 and 2804-2? Both of these calibers are mechanical movements, but the main difference between them is that the ETA 2824-2 is an automatic and the 2804-2 is a manual-wind movement.. ...

I have owned this watch since late 1996 and have never gotten the ETA 2824-2 movement serviced; but yet...it has remained accurate to about +5 seconds/day. It winds and sets beautifully and smoothly...while the date mechanism functions perfectly. The movement ticks away at high-beat levels seemingly without a care in the world.

The ETA caliber 2834-2 is a Swiss made automatic movement with a day-date complication. The calendar display on this movement is similar to the Rolex President Day-Date, with a full day of the week indicator at 12:00 and a date at 3:00 (also possible at 6:00 depending on the dial design).. The ETA 2824-2 is, without a doubt, the most well-known and prevalent Swiss automatic caliber. It began life as the 2824 (without the "-2") in 1971, although the movement can trace certain design features like the rotor with ball bearings back to 1948's Eterna 1247. Despite its extensive history, the design is far from obsolete today.
