

Where should tea be stored?

How long do Tea Bags Last?

While teabags can be kept in a sealed container in a cool,dark location for 1-2 years, it is best to use them within 4 months after opening for optimal flavor.

How do you store a tea bag?

The bags that suppliers sell tea in vary widely in terms of quality. For long-term storage,make sure your bags are multi-ply with an inner layer of foil or glassine(a substance similar to wax paper). This avoids contamination by water,air or grease. A tight seal is key. If the mechanism can hold water, it can protect tea. Good options include:
