

# How to fill the flywheel energy storage

How does Flywheel energy storage work?

Flywheel energy storage (FES) works by accelerating a rotor (flywheel) to a very high speed and maintaining the energy in the system as rotational energy.

What are the components of a flywheel energy storage system?

A flywheel energy storage system consists of bearings, a rotating mass, a motor-generator, and a frequency inverter. Fig. 14.4 shows the main components of a flywheel energy storage system. The design of the components influences the overall efficiency, and can help in reducing power transmission losses.

What is a flywheel energy storage system (fess)?

Think of it as a mechanical storage tool that converts electrical energy into mechanical energy for storage. This energy is stored in the form of rotational kinetic energy. Typically, the energy input to a Flywheel Energy Storage System (FESS) comes from an electrical source like the grid or any other electrical source.

Could flywheels be the future of energy storage?

Flywheels, one of the earliest forms of energy storage, could play a significant role in the transformation of the electrical power system into one that is fully sustainable yet low cost.

How to connect flywheel energy storage system (fess) to an AC grid?

To connect the Flywheel Energy Storage System (FESS) to an AC grid, another bi-directional converter is necessary. This converter can be single-stage (AC-DC) or double-stage (AC-DC-AC). The power electronic interface has a high power capability, high switching frequency, and high efficiency.

How can flywheel energy storage improve battery life & system availability?

To improve battery life and system availability, flywheels can be combined with batteries to extend battery run time and reduce the number of yearly battery discharges that reduce battery life (Figure 2). Many types of medical imaging equipment, such as CT or MRI machines can also benefit from flywheel energy storage systems.

On a high level, flywheel energy storage systems have two major components: a rotor (i.e., flywheel) and an electric motor. These systems work by having the electric motor accelerate the rotor to high speeds, effectively converting the original electrical energy into a stored form of rotational energy (i.e., angular momentum).

Flywheel energy storage systems (FESS) employ kinetic energy stored in a rotating mass with very low frictional losses. Electric energy input accelerates the mass to speed via an integrated motor-generator. The energy is discharged by drawing down the kinetic energy using the same motor-generator.
